June has a new vision for the Heritage Resale Shop that includes insulation and an HVAC system to stretch the shopping season. The shop will be rearranged to accommodate furniture currently stored in our smallest building.

"We're removing some of the bulkier shelving units," June said, "and moving our hardware department to the current furniture building."

Her plan also includes relocating the checkout counter and donation drop off area closer to the entrance to make accepting donations easier.

Museum Manager Kendra Koehler, who has been supervising work this fall, reported that sisters Linda Parker and Jeanette Luecke have transported boxes of items that have been sitting unsold for years to Goodwill in Port Clinton when making trips to the mainland this fall.

The "Parker Girls" have been regulars at the fall cleanup and reorganization along with Anne Auger and Susette Luecke. Mariah Loud pitched in to help move the heavier displays and furniture.

"Everyone has been great," Kendra said. "We have fantastic volunteers."
